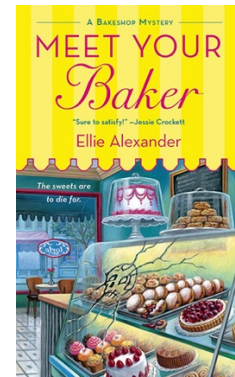


Meet Your Baker

2. Starting over can be difficult, but Jules has some help with the transition. What help does she have to ease the transition? Have you ever been given aid at a hard point in your life? What and why?
3. Murder hits close to home and Jules has to decide who she can trust to help solve the case. How does Jules decide who to trust? How do you decide who you can trust in a difficult situation?
4. Ashland is a lively town. What is going on in the town during this book? Have you ever lived in a town that centered around community events like Ashland does?
5. Torte is home for Jules. What do we learn about Jules by reading about Torte? What do the places we call home say about us?
6. Some say you can't go home, but Jules does. Has there been a time in your life that you had to return to your roots, or make a big change? How was it similar to what Jules went through? How was it different?
7. The staff at Torte is more of a family than a group of colleagues. Have you ever worked with co-workers who become more like family? How did that change the working environment?
8. In this book, we learn a little bit about Jules's relationship with her husband, Carlos. What do we learn about Jules and what she values about relationships from her relationship with Carlos?
